

The Crossroads of the West

Ideally located less than an hour from Noumea and twenty minutes from La Tontouta International Airport, the town of Boulouparis continues to develop, from every point of view. Its geographical position, strategically situated on the north-south axis as well as on the east-west axis by the Thio transversal road, makes it the present and future crossroads of the Southern Bush Province.

A mix of sea, river, and mountains, Boulouparis is known for the bay of Saint-Vincent and its thirty-eight islets, Ouenghi river and Ouitchambo peak. The quality of life of the people of Boulouparis is enriched daily by this abundant and diverse natural setting. Favoured with a low population density, the tranquillity and charm of life here is shared by all the inhabitants, both from the villages and the tribes.


As a result of these various attributes Boulouparis' population of 3,700 inhabitants, doubles at weekends, under the impact of tourism and second homes. In addition, the population dynamics mean that the municipality is expected to reach 5,000 inhabitants by 2030.

Our values

A rural identity combining the present and the future

The identity of Boulouparis has its roots in its history. Its link to the land, and more broadly to the natural world, is the common denominator of all the populations that make it up. Kanaks, for whom the attachment to the land is deep and fundamental, freed convicts and pioneers for whom the land was a promise for the future, and immigrant workers who came to lend a hand in its development... and still today, the accessibility to a desirable piece of land is the main driver for moving to the area, but its appeal is increased where, in addition, there exists a unique combination of rural identity combined with a modern attitude to the future.

The best of all worlds

The location of Boulouparis, ideally located at the crossroads of north/ south and east/west, has always favoured the development of human, cultural and economic exchanges. At the crossroads of the customary paths between the clans of the sea and those of the land, Boulouparis is also at the crossroads of the town and the bush. Thus, its profoundly rural identity is constantly nourished by the most diverse influences, without ever losing sight of its fundamentals: to cultivate a quality of life where simplicity and tranquillity are combined on a daily basis, whilst maintaining respect for everyone.

Resolutely focused on the future

Rich in its past, and resolutely turned towards the future, Boulouparis advocates an identity that is both rural and contemporary, where economic development is carried out for the benefit of the population, while taking care of the environment. The best of the bush, combined with the standards of the town: this is the ambition of the municipality, for the well-being of all its inhabitants; and all those who will become one.



Our ambitions for the future

Aware of the resources and fundamental values of Boulouparis and its population, the municipal team is working to anticipate the effects of its natural population growth by promoting the creation of activities and jobs in the municipality. The objective is to create a new economic ecosystem in the Tontouta/ Boulouparis basin in order to avoid a daily flight of resources to the city. As a result, the strategic roadmap of the mayor and his team revolves around four major themes.



Putting people at the centre of priorities

Development of public services, particularly in the areas of education, health and well-being, and all actions promoting inter-community and intergenerational relations, including the creation of new spaces for leisure and exchange.



Keeping the economy balanced

Support for the economic fabric in place, by promoting the issue of transmission. Hosting job-creating projects, with priority given to the people of the municipality, and particularly the younger generations. Initiatives related to sustainable development and preserving the environment are particularly encouraged (renewable energies, eco-tourism, sustainable agriculture, reduced supply chains, etc.).





Developing tourism

Today, more than ever, the link with nature is a value that brings people together. The aim is to highlight the identity and diversity of Boulouparis, by promoting the development of eco-tourism that respects the environment and residents. Events and activities, organized with the inhabitants of the villages as well as those of the tribes, contribute to the energy of the commune. The town is now labelled a «green resort».

Cultivating a spirit of openness

Promote the development of intermunicipal projects, such as those related to the urban area, by focusing on new forms of collaboration.

Intensify links with the three twin towns (Queensland, French Polynesia, and Vietnam). Develop international partnerships related to promising themes for the municipality, in particular agriculture, sport and culture.



 - ¶ 12 new businesses within the municipal industrial zone (**ZIA**). (Boulouparis village)
 - ¶ The **«pink gallery»**, has been transformed into a commercial area, which offers 7 lots for rent. (Boulouparis village)
 - ¶ Solar farms: after the Hélio Boulouparis 1 solar farm, created in 2017 (12 MWp), followed the Hélio Boulouparis 2 storage plant in 2019 (15 MWp), TotalEnergies Pacifique is continuing its development with **Hélio Boulouparis 3** (60MWp), which will eventually triple the site's production capacity (90MWp of installed capacity).
 - ¶ Opening of a food retail store in November 2021 with the takeover of the former Tran Duc supermarket by the **Aline-Auchan group**. (Boulouparis village)

- ¶ Opening in 2022 of a wine cellar La Vinothèque.
 - (Boulouparis village)
- ¶ Opening in June 2022 of **AK Boat**, dry marina and its mini market. (Bouraké)
- ¶ Opening of the **VIP hair salon** in November 2022. (Boulouparis village)
- ¶ Opening in November 2022 of a **Mobil boutique service station** (village de Boulouparis)
- ¶ Shell boutique service station and restaurant opening in December 2023 (Tomo)


